

Medication Descriptions

Acepromazine: oral tranquilizer

Amoxicillin (Amoxitabs or Drops): oral antibiotic

Atropine: topical dilator of the eye and can help with ocular pain from ulcers. Not to be used with glaucoma.

Azithromycin: oral antibiotic

BNP Ophthalmic Ointment: triple antibiotic for infection.

Cosopt: anti-glaucoma medication

Cromolyn Sodium: topical mast-cell stabilizer: used for allergic conjunctivitis.

Cyclosporine: topical tear stimulant and decreases scarring and pigmentation on the cornea.

Daranide: oral anti-glaucoma medication

Doxycycline: oral antibiotic

Imuran: antimetabolite used for intraocular inflammation

Maxitrol (BNP + Dexamethasone): antibiotic and topical steroid to decrease inflammation, scarring and pigmentation.

Muro 128: hypertonic saline for swelling of the cornea (edema).

Neptazane (methazolamide): oral anti-glaucoma medication

Orbax: oral antibiotic

Pred Forte (Pred Acetate): topical steroid to decrease inflammation, scarring and pigmentation.

Tacrolimus: second generation stimulant and decreases scarring and pigmentation on the cornea.

Timoptic: anti-glaucoma medication

Tobramycin: topical antibiotic

Tramadol: oral pain medication

Travatan: anti-glaucoma medication

Tropicamide: topical dilator of the pupil

Trusopt: anti-glaucoma medication

Tylan Powder: oral antibiotic used for tear staining

Vigamox: topical antibiotic

Voltaren: topical non-steroidal anti-inflammatory

Xalatan: anti-glaucoma medication
